Golden Rules for All Adult Members

Do -

- ✓ Listen
- Reassure Junior that they have done nothing wrong. It is not their fault.
- ✓ Take allegations seriously.
- ✓ Affirm Junior's feelings.

Do Not -

- Guarantee Confidentiality
- **x** Tell them how they should feel.
- Be judgmental or show disbelief.

Questions -

- Allow the young person to share their story in their own way.
- Only ask questions to clarify your understanding
- Do not ask leading questions.

Child Protection Procedures

Actions to take when you have a concern.

- Contact one of the Thurso Players' Child Protection Officers who will take the next actions according to the Thurso Players' Child Protection Procedures.
- Record the discussion/incident by completing, signing, and dating a Thurso Players' Record of Concern form and pass this to the Child Protection Officer.
- If neither of the Thurso Players' Child Protection Officers is available, contact Highland Council Duty Social Worker, (or the Police on 999 if you are concerned of immediate risk of harm) and give details.
- Why there is a concern.
- Is Junior in imminent danger, are there any other children who may be at risk?
- o Junior's name, age, DoB and address.
- Name of adult who has care of the Junior (Parent/Guardian).

It is important that you do not delay in taking action.
